The Kaddish or Qaddish (Aramaic: קדיש , qaddiṣ "holy"; alternative spelling: Ḳaddish) is a hymn of praises to God found in Jewish prayer services. The central theme of the Kaddish is the magnification and sanctification of God's name. In the liturgy, different versions of the Kaddish are used functionally as separators between sections of the service.

The Kaddish is a prayer that praises God and expresses a yearning for the establishment of God's kingdom on earth. The emotional reactions inspired by the Kaddish come from the circumstances in which it is said: it is recited at funerals and by mourners, and sons are required to say Kaddish for eleven months after the death of a parent.

Kaddish definition is - a Jewish prayer recited in the daily ritual of the synagogue and by mourners at public services after the death of a close relative.

Kaddish is the Jewish mourner's prayer in remembrance of the departed. It is recited daily for eleven months after the passing of a loved one, at each morning and two evening prayer services, and thereafter on every annual Yahrzeit – the Hebrew date on which a loved one passed.

Chatzi Kaddish / קדיש חצי — Half Kaddish is recited only by a cantor to mark a transition from one part of the prayer service to the next. (We use the word “cantor” to refer to anybody who leads the prayer services, but does not necessarily sing.) The only exception is the Chatzi Kadish after the Torah reading, which in some congregations is recited by one of the mourners.
