Learning Theories: The Three Representational Modes. All information that is perceived via the senses passes through three processors that encode it as linguistic, nonlinguistic, or affective representations (Marzano, 1998).

Effort Justification - people who are persuaded to put more effort toward achieving a goal exaggerate the attractiveness of the goal to justify their effort. Since persuasion is the inherent goal of communication, it's easy to see why cognitive dissonance plays such a large role in the
